City Parks

Sawhill Park has one of the last band shells in Kansas. It is located near the Cheyenne County Courthouse. There is a basketball/tennis court on the east side of the Courthouse and 2 shelters in the park for picnics. The park has playground equipment, tables, grills and restrooms. The City also owns Roadside Park and Campground on highway 36. It features picnic tables, restrooms, and showers.

What I may need to know:

Does my dog or cat need a **tag**? Your dog will need to be registered each January. The fee is \$3 for each neutered or spayed dog and \$10 for each un-neutered animal. Please bring a certificate of immunization against rabies. For more information, please contact the City office.

Other licenses: I want to open a business. If you plan to open a business in a location zoned commercial, (other than a business selling liquor), the City does not require a license. If you plan to open a **home-based business**, you must apply for a zoning variance and the City council must approve the application. Others needing a license include **solicitors, canvassers and peddlers, junk dealers, traveling shows, and tree, shrub or landscape contractors.** (Chapter V: 2003 City Code) For more information, please contact the City office.

When do I need a **building permit**? If you plan to build or replace a fence, run concrete or anything that will change the structure of a building including enlarging or removing the structure. Forms and more information are available at the City office.

Where can I take items to **recycle**?

Newspaper, magazines, cans, etc. can be taken to the City owned recycle center on Highway 36 (behind the museum). The United Methodist Women “recycle” some used clothing. They have opened a thrift Store on Washington Street.

Welcome to St. Francis!

We hope the information in this pamphlet is helpful.

It is the policy of the governing body of the City of St. Francis **not** to mail utility bills. The water and light bills are due on the 1st of the month. They may be paid at City Hall, 209 East Washington, without penalty, between the 1st and the 15th of the month. If you wish to mail your check or drop it in the night box and need to know your amount, you may call the City Office at 332-3142 between 8 am and 5 pm.

It is also possible to have your bill taken directly to the bank for collection. If you choose this method, your account will be debited on the 4th of each month.

Payments received after the 15th of the month will be charged a \$10.20 late charge.

If payment is not received by 10 am on the 25th of the month, services will be shut off. There will be an additional \$26.82 reconnect charge to have services restored.
